



### ***Washington State 4-H Shooting Sports Code of Conduct***

As a participant you have the responsibility of representing the Washington State 4-H Shooting Sports Program. You are expected to conduct yourself in a manner that will bring honor to you, your family, 4-H and Washington State.

#### **As a 4-H Member I will:**

1. Attend all sessions in the planned program and notify a leader if I am unable to attend.
2. Follow safety, range, etiquette, and room rules. I am responsible for knowing the rules.
3. Use good judgment in selecting clothing appropriate to the occasion and weather.
4. Use language and manners that will bring respect to Washington State 4-H and myself.
5. Be in the assigned program area at all times. Horseplay or similar socializing inside/outside of the buildings is prohibited.
6. Follow the state's 4-H driving policy regarding events and activities.
7. Know that the use of alcohol, tobacco, and non-prescribed drugs is illegal and prohibited at all events. Inform adult leader of use of all medication.
8. Show courtesy and respect for all other people. Demonstrate good sportsmanship.
9. Treat program areas, lodging areas and vehicles with respect and care. I will be responsible for any damage, theft, or misconduct in which I participate.
10. Help other members in my group have a pleasant experience by making every attempt to include all participants in activities without prejudice.
11. Live up to my highest expectations for myself so I can return home proud of who I am and what I have done.
12. Abide by the Washington State 4-H Behavior Guidelines.
13. Work cooperatively with other 4-H participants, youth, volunteer leaders, families, Cooperative Extension faculty and staff, and others in a courteous, respectful manner.

#### ***If I do not conduct myself within the above guidelines, I may expect:***

1. To explain my actions to the adults in charge and to accept consequences of my actions.
2. To be dismissed from the event and sent home early at parent/guardian expense.
3. To have adults in charge work closely with parents/guardians, Extension personnel and others to see that disciplinary actions taken are appropriate and logical consequences for all concerned.
4. A letter describing the infraction and/or inappropriate behavior to be sent to my parent/guardian and county Extension Office.

**I have read and understand the Washington State 4-H Shooting Sports Code of Conduct and agree to live up to these expectations. I realize my failure to do so could result in a loss of privileges related to the 4-H Shooting Sports Program now and/or in the future.**
